

From the Clergy

Spring feels just around the corner. Daylight is stretching itself further across the day; daffodils are breaking bud and the birds are singing earlier and louder each day ... wonderful!

Spring tempts us to become like Mole at the opening of 'The Wind in the Willows', over busying ourselves with spring cleaning ('how did those windows become so smeary?') or a host of exciting new projects.

We can take a similar approach in our spiritual lives. Lent arrives with a burgeoning list of newly published books for us to buy (and possibly even to read!) and there are also a host of online resources which can conveniently be delivered to our inbox each morning. We're tempted to wonder if this may be *the* Lent that makes all the difference to our journey with God.

But what if we were to step aside from all those exciting options? What if less might be more? Might we learn to shed some of the 'stuff' we carry, and walk a little more lightly, whilst appreciating there might be some heavy loads we can't lay down right now? If we can be less weighed down, we might look around and notice all that's good – the beauty of our countryside, the kindness of neighbours. Lent could become a time to notice God working in the mundane, daily routines of life or, as a I read recently, we might 'discover the holiness of the ordinary.' This is good news if we're feeling worn out and untouched by spring-time vigour.

Amid his busyness, Mole heard another spring-time voice, one that instead drew him out of his underground home to roll in the warm grass of a meadow. In that moment, he noticed the sun's warmth on his fur, the bird's song, the 'joy of living and the delight of spring without the cleaning'.

It's in these moments of deep connection with all of God's creation that I feel God's presence most keenly. Held in that presence, I also feel able to reflect honestly on where I am on my spiritual journey with God. It's in these holy moments that transformation can happen.

So, let's embrace the wisdom of Mole this Lent, let's lay down our paintbrushes (or whatever distractions we carry) and find ourselves a meadow ... or even just our own back lawn! Blessings – Revd Luci



MICHAELCHURCH ESCLEY PRIMARY & PRE-SCHOOL Well, what a short half term the first half of the Spring Term has been! Five weeks is not much but it is enough for the children and staff at Michaelchurch to pack a fair bit of fun and active, outdoor learning in.

Not long into the term, Oak Class (our oldest children in the school) headed off into the stunningly beautiful hills around Knighton to visit the Spaceguard Centre – an astronomical centre dedicated to the search of near Earth objects; that is to say, big chunks of rock flying through space that might collide with our planet! They learnt tons about the solar system and how to explore the night skies.

Also out and about were Acorn Class (our 5, 6 and 7yr olds), as they visited the excellent Waterworks Museum in Hereford. There they engaged in a whole host of watery activities. They had a wonderful time and learnt a lot about how safe drinking water is delivered to thousands of homes. Speaking of water, swimming lessons have started up again at Michaelchurch. These lessons take place at a private pool in Bronllys and are run by our two qualified swimming instructors/lifeguards Miss Cook and Mrs Davies (nee Miss Matthews). The lessons take part throughout the year and children receive the instruction every year of their time with us until they can swim.

In school, we have had great fun at our exciting after-school clubs this term. The drama club, provided by the Courtyard Theatre, has been extremely popular and the children have had great fun exercising their theatrical talents. Likewise, cookery club have continued to produce some delicious baked goods – most recently they made cheese scones which were delicious! In addition to this we have a highly popular Craft Club where creativity is the order of the day!

Coming up, the whole school are heading into Hay on Wye for a World Book Day day out. Then Acorn Class are heading off to West Midland Safari Park, Sapling (the middle class – 7, 8 and 9yr olds) are going all Viking up at the Battlelands Paintball Centre and Oak Class are heading to Gloucester to visit Gloucester Mosque and Cathedral. Preschool meanwhile are heading off to a local farm, hoping to see some newborn lambs!

Finally, we will be holding another one of our highly popular Welly Walks on Tuesday 5th March, from 9:15 to 11am. Parents/carers with children aged 2 to 4 are very welcome to join us for a delightful ramble over our beautiful local environment. This will be followed by hot choc, toasts and some singing back in preschool after the walk. Please do get in touch if you'd like to join us!


