



From the Clergy

What a strange time of year this is. Darker, colder, harder. And brimming with mystery and weird hope. Advent serves as a kind of long dawn, leading us towards the disarming light of a vulnerable, sweet, refugee baby who is God with us, kingdom come, Immanuel.

Does this little child knock gently on the door of your heart, calling you to some tender acts of seasonal charity? Or perhaps your eyes, blinking in the light, become adjusted to the unorthodox patterns of the kingdom of God that is breaking through, full of promise: last become first, strangers become welcome, enemies loved, the humble lifted. Little Jesus: glorious, preposterous disrupter.

In the overwhelming days and nights of our personal circumstances, in the pervasively unbalanced poopiness of the state of our world, the magic of this time of year invites us into a moment of suspension of business as usual. We raise our heads from normal life and see something beyond the pervasive powers and systems we all operate within. God is here with us. Our hope becomes a peaceful, determined protest.

Enjoy the twinkly lights and sparkles in all their loveliness: they symbolise that stubborn, determined Christmas hope, shining out joy in the murky darkness, representing a love that knows no bounds, encompassing us all. The little baby Jesus from your nativity scene is offering every one of us a peace that runs deeper.

My reflection here is inspired by author Kate Bowler, and I leave you with some of her words of blessing.

Blessed are we who cry out: Oh God, why does the bad always seem to win? When will good prevail? We know you are good, but we see so little goodness.

God, show us your heart, how you seek out the broken. Lift us on your shoulders, and carry us home – no matter how strong we think we are.

God, seek us out, and find us, we your tired people, and lead us out to where hope lies,

where your kingdom will come

and your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Fill us with your courage.

Calm us with your love.

Fortify us with your hope. Amen.

I pray for you all a good Christmas, safety and warmth over the winter months, and hearts full of compassion and determined hope.

Concerts for Craswall

Top brass visit Fairfield High School

Top brass players inspired young students to get involved with music when they visited Fairfield High School the day before their sell-out concert at St Michael's Church in Michaelchurch Escley last month.

Commissioned by Concerts for Craswall, the lively quintet provided an interactive introduction to brass instruments and live music, performing for over 200 students including visiting pupils from the Michaelchurch Escley primary school, followed by workshops for budding young musicians.

Still in their mid-20s, the musicians are all rising stars and have performed widely in the UK and across Europe, yet take a refreshingly, non-stuffy approach to performing as part of their mission to make classical music more accessible to all.

Gary Crocker, Deputy Head Teacher, Michaelchurch Escley Primary School said: "The children really enjoyed it (as did I) and loved seeing true professionals performing close up."

Fairfield music teacher Melanie Sage added: "Hosting Connaught Brass was a great opportunity for our students to hear live music and find out about brass playing. I know a number of them have been inspired to take up instruments, and we will do all we can to support them."

Supported with funding from The Cavatina Chamber Music Trust, the sessions reflected Concerts for Craswall's aim to encourage talented young local musicians and to inspire a new generation.

Chairman Edward Milford said: "We were delighted to work with Connaught Brass, Michaelchurch Primary and Fairfield High schools and hope the experience will encourage more young people and their families to enjoy our friendly, informal concerts."


