

From the Clergy

In August, Angie Kateley, our Curate, was ordained priest just as I celebrated thirty five years of that vocation in the midst of my fifty tenth year. There is a time for everything under the sun, and this seems a good time to reflect on being a priest.

I've served in NHS chaplaincy in a very busy London hospital, and through the move from a large psychiatric institution to community care. I've been a rural dean, team rector of large, rural multi-parish areas, and deep in the midst of time I was an innocent newbie in a cluster of parishes in rural Hampshire.

I've been supported to train in psychotherapy, and as a spiritual director. These led to a post as director of the London Spirituality Centre in the City, near Bank tube station, and locum director of the Marylebone Health and Healing Centre.

All of this has led me to the conclusion that what a priest needs is a deep sense of awe and ignorance. I may have endless post-nominals, registrations, and accreditations but awe and ignorance will do just nicely thank you very much.

St Paul puts it like this, "If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have absolute faith so as to move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing."

For me awe and ignorance is a complete contrast to the military tactic of shock and awe, technically known as rapid dominance, that is based on overwhelming force and spectacular displays of force to paralyse the enemy's perception of the battlefield and destroy their will to fight (OUP). Once upon a time the church was like that, a deeply flawed, narcissistic version of Ghost Busters.

Living in awe and ignorance is to see all whom I meet as wonders made in the image of God, whose lives, full of joys and challenges, are worth paying attention to. It's to remember that my words and gestures and actions take place in the midst of a great drama, about the details of which I know little or nothing. In our disordered society, building and cultivating relationships is the most significant thing we can do on earth.

People let us down. Wounds can cut deep. Some heal and some don't. We start where we are, and continue on this journey of answering the divine leading, and placing ourselves in a position to learn and grow. With love, awe and ignorance. *Mark Godson*

WENATCHEE TRINITY CHURCH GIRLS CHOIR ON THE GOLDEN VALLEY PILGRIM WAY

Today I am recovering from a week of walking the Golden Valley Pilgrim Way last with 18 North Americans compromising a Girls' choir, 4 Mums and their pastor Matt and his wife Julie, the choir leader. It was a blast. They took up their staffs, back packs and scallop shells with total enthusiasm. They sang Evensong in 6 of our Churches across the Deanery; they stayed the night in churches along the path and in one case slept in bell tents next to Craswall Church. Near Tyberton they received a holy well blessing and taught me to play wild volleyball in the hills above Michaelchurch

Escley. They loved the welcome they received from people along the way and meeting Prince Charles in Hay on Wye! They seemed to be blown away by the landscape and the food in each of the pubs. Whenever they were cooked for, they sang a thank you and in one case as our path crossed a garden, they sang a blessing over the crops.

I was so impressed with the way they used the silent walking and contemplative practice to reflect on their own journey of faith and they all kept a journal to record their feelings and reflections. What I did not expect from a group so young was their spiritual maturity especially in the way they discipled one another. The sheer positivity was inspiring. One of them wrote these words in a letter and then ended with some words from Psalm 90.

'What a divine honour to walk the Golden Valley Pilgrim Way, to know the land so intimately, to come face to face with the people of this place and to be your teammates in pioneering this beautiful vision you've shared. I cherish everything – our shared joy and growth, delightful ice cream, 'wild volleyball' (and frisbee), centring prayer amongst the oaks, and most especially a mystical holy well...'

Oh! Teach us to live well!

Teach us to live wisely and well!

Come back, GOD—how long do we have to wait? and treat your servants with kindness for a change.

Surprise us with love at daybreak;

then we'll skip and dance all the day long. Make up for the bad times with some good times;

- we've seen enough evil to last a lifetime. Let your servants see what you're best at—
- the ways you rule and bless your children. And let the loveliness of our Lord, our God, rest on us,

confirming the work that we do. Oh, yes. Affirm the work that we do!




