# From the Clergy

'Come to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest ...' *Matthew 11:28* 

Perfect words for August as many of us step away from our usual routine and take a break, either at home or elsewhere.

But perhaps these words strike at a deeper level than our desire for a few days off? Perhaps this kind of weariness happens when we invest time and energy in things that don't align with what we believe is our life's purpose.

Not living out our purpose is not uncommon. We may feel compelled to keep doing the thing that pays the bills or allows us to take care of people who depend on us. We may also be fearful of taking another path in life. What if I fail? What will others think if I try something new?

If you're left wondering how you might better live out your life's purpose, or discover what this is, the start of these words from Jesus tells us how. 'Come to me ...'. We're not left to work this out for ourselves; our life's purpose is a shared endeavour. Finding out what we were created for requires input from the Creator. Jesus calls us to get in step with him, so he can help us to find our life's purpose. You might like to begin by using a simple prayer I've discovered recently. To find a moment every morning to be still, perhaps whilst the kettle is boiling for your morning cuppa, or whilst you're cleaning your teeth, and ask 'What are we doing together today God?' and see where you're led. *Blessings, Revd Luci*

# Local Newsround

## MICHAELCHURCH ESCLEY PRIMARY AND PRE-SCHOOL

The summer term in a primary school is always a very busy time, with so much seeming to happen in a really short space of time. At the end of June, Oak Class had their muchanticipated Activity Week and they really did have an incredibly exciting, if rather exhausting, time. Their week began with canoeing and then caving, followed by horse riding, hill walking, paintball, roller skating and finally mountain biking in the Forest of Dean! We were so proud of the way the children took part in such a diverse range of activities with so much confidence and enthusiasm. It was also lovely for us to be able to make use of and support a wide range of local providers, making use of the amazing facilities we have in this area.

Following this we sent a large team of children, from Years 3 to 6, to the School Games in Hereford. The children had a fantastic time there and were delighted to come 3rd in the dodge-ball!

We were also pleased once again to be able to take a large group of children, 20 this year, on our, now traditional, mountain bike ride to Hay on Wye. Known in the school as the 'Bay-to-Hay' after the first time we completed the ride,

the trip is fantastic fun but also extremely challenging and everyone feels a huge sense of achievement when they finally roll into Hay and collect their reward – a Shepherds ice-cream!

The younger children have not missed out on the excitement either. First, they went off to St Fagans in Cardiff to learn about how houses and buildings have changed over time. St Fagans is a wonderful place and it goes without saying that the children had a brilliant time there. Then, some brave Acorn children from Years 1 and 2, along with some equally brave staff members, 'camped' out at school in the hall. They enjoyed a lovely tea, plenty of treats and a super film night before settling down to a relatively uneventful night. We feel extremely fortunate that we have staff who are willing to give up their time (and their sleep) to provide such super experiences for the children.

More recently, the children of Year 6 have received their SATS results. The children at Michaelchurch know that we value so much more than the results of a few tests which look at only a tiny fraction of the skills and capabilities of our young people. However, the children do work so hard through the year and are rightly proud of the results they achieved. We are particularly proud of our Reading result where 100% of our 11 Year 6 children met the expected standard and 55% of our Year 6s achieved a standard of Greater Depth. This is against a national figure of 73% meeting the expected level in reading with a reading test which was widely considered to be the most challenging for many years.

Whilst all this has been happening, we have been frantically rehearsing at every opportunity for our summer outdoor theatre production at Michaelchurch Court. This year we are performing *Matilda the Musical Junior*...and the children have absolutely loved learning and performing the many amazing songs in the show.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a very happy and hopefully sunny and warm summer. Remember, we are always happy to show families around the school and preschool if you would like your child to join us in our learning adventures! Although some year groups are full, we do still have some spaces and are always happy to chat to prospective new families. #### LONGTOWN PARISH COUNCIL Post Script July 19th meeting

At this meeting held on Wednesday, 19th July, in Longtown Village Hall, Councillor Philip Price was able to reasuure us that he would support the Parish Council in their bid to have the area by the School limited to 20 mph. Those of you who are hawk eyed will recall that we had a site meeting earlier to discuss the problem with the Transport Councillor, who was also supporting but, with the May elections and a change of Council, this support disappeared.

We are pleased that we can take it up again, and hopefully get a satisfactory conclusion.

Councillor Price's report was very varied and detailed, touching on the issues around the phosphates and the flooding of the River Wye, the discussion about the new Hereford Library and the efforts being made to get the serious projects of the South Wye Link road, the Western Bypass and the Eastern River crossing back on the agenda for government support.

He paid tribute to our much liked and admired County Councillor Peter Jinman, and agreed to give the Parish Council support until a new Councillor could be elected.

A reminder that Longtown Parish Council do not meet in August, but we shall reconvene on Wednesday 20th September at 8pm in Longtown Village Hall. Members of the Public will be warmly welcomed.

And some advance warning for you: The Parish Council meeting in February 2024 will be held in Craswall Village Hall, and that in March 2024 will be in Walterstone Village Hall.

#### GOLDEN VALLEY FACES AT HAY CASTLE The photographs of Richard Jenkins



Born in 1890 in Newton, Richard Jenkins was a bright, curious young man who longed to study to be an engineer, to be part of the technological revolution that was going on in the outside world. But as the only son of a farmer he had to stay on the farm.

He consoled himself by learning to take and develop photographs, and

produced a remarkable collection of telling images, showing his friends and neighbours at every stage in their lives, paying tribute to their toughness and their skills. Their faces speak with all the freshness and vigour they had a hundred years ago.

Miraculously, after decades of neglect, more than eight hundred of Jenkins' glass plate negatives survived, and are now in the safe keeping of HARC.

A selection was published in Hilary Engel's book, *Golden Valley Faces*, in 2020; and since then several exhibitions have helped to establish Jenkins' reputation as an exceptional photographer.
