

### From the Clergy

#### Dear friends

In the Lord's Prayer, we pray: ... on earth as it is in Heaven.

What is Heaven? Perhaps the first thing that comes to your imagination is a shining city in the clouds with big, pearly gates and Saint Peter ready to check the guest list for your name. Or maybe your brain starts playing the Belinda Carlisle song: *Ooh, Heaven is a place on Earth.* 

Perhaps the simplest way to describe Heaven is 'where God is' and 'where we go when we die' – not necessarily a physical place that could be found on a map, but instead some place or state of things which is metaphysical – beyond the human state of being.

Although much of the Christian understanding of *the place* of Heaven comes from the apocalyptic dream described in *the Revelations according to John*, our greater understating of Heaven comes from the stories Jesus told, in which he would often begin: *the Kingdom of God/Heaven is like...*(a sower sowing seed; a mustard seed; a prized pearl; a woman searching for a lost coin; workers in a vineyard; a wedding party; a father celebrating the return of his wayward son; a shepherd searching for his lost sheep...and more)

From these stories, we come to learn that Heaven is where we are close to and loved by God, where we are valued and celebrated, where there is new life and forgiveness, and true acceptance. It is something to be sought after and prized, just as we are sought after and prized by God.

Through these stories, we also learn that not only is Heaven is our eternal resting place in God's loving presence, but also something which can bleed through to our lives in the current moment.

Heaven transforms us. It brings peace and order and justice, and an end to pain, conflict, sickness, and suffering. And, at the end, Heaven transforms death into eternal life.

When we pray, *on Earth as it is in Heaven*, we are asking God to usher in this Kingdom of Heaven, to weaken the barrier so that we may be as close to God as we will be in eternity, and so that Heaven may transform our lives for the better.

May Heaven be ever nearer to you today than it was yesterday, and ever closer to you tomorrow that it is today. Yours in faith, Revd Cate

Every year, outside hospital, there are over 30,000 cardiac arrests in the UK with a survival rate lower than one in ten. However, if a defibrillator is used within 3-5 minutes those survival rates go up to between 50-70%.

As a new defibrillator has been installed outside the Cornewall Arms those positive statistics now apply to the residents of Clodock.

This has been made possible by fund-raising events and the generous contributions from local individuals and organisations.

A demonstration on its use will take place on **Monday 10 July** at 7pm in the Cornewall Arms.

We have now gone back to our normal opening times of 10 am -12 pm.


