



From the Clergy

The Platinum Jubilee as you know is coming up in early June with countless wonderful celebrations locally and around the country. We are celebrating the Queen's 70-year reign and at the core of her reign is the Queen's service to her people. The Queen sees voluntary and public service as one of the most important parts of her work and indeed on her 21st birthday vowed 'I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service'.

One of the glimmers of light that came out of Covid in this part of the world was the love and care that people gave to their neighbours — by keeping in touch, helping with shopping, collecting prescriptions and generally watching out for the people who lived near them. Before Covid they may have known them by sight but probably hadn't had time to get to know them better. It was very heartening and this connection remains with us and makes our communities better, kinder places.

Service is viewed as a rather old-fashioned word in some quarters but it is at the heart of the Christian Gospel. After he washed their feet at the Last Supper Jesus told his disciples that 'I have set you an example, you also should do what I have done to you.' St Paul reiterates this in his letter to the Philippians reminding us that we should 'in humility regard others as better than ourselves'. The Christian adage to love your neighbour as yourself is not always easy – so it's worth remembering the words the Queen wrote in 2016:

For me, Christ is a role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to respect and value all people of whatever faith or none'.

Whatever our challenges, fears and aspirations, these are words to give us direction and hope.





CLIMATE MATTERS

You may have noticed the signs upon the Castle Green in May, where an area was set aside for No Mow May.

No Mow May is a campaign run by Plantlife to encourage as many of us as possible to allow wildflowers in our gardens and community spaces to grow and set seed.

Allowing the flowers to bloom means there is food for insects, which is desperately needed as our insect populations have plummeted in recent years. Fewer insects mean less food for other wildlife, so anything we can do to support them is critical to our collective efforts to reverse the decline in biodiversity.

But this is just the tip of the iceberg of the benefits of No Mow May. Allowing the flowers to bloom and set seed helps to maintain the diversity of flowers in our grasslands.

If flowers aren't allowed to set seed, then a vicious cycle sets in. Populations of annuals will die out quickly. Perennials may come back for a few years but ultimately, as they can't

live forever, their populations will die out too. Those that can reproduce through other means, such as rhizomes or tubers, will begin to dominate and make it near impossible for populations of less dominant plants to recover.

This in turn reduces the diversity of food sources for our wildlife and those populations also begin to decline.

But it isn't just food that is important, it is also vital habitat for all parts of the life cycle.

For example, the delicate pinky/lilac blooms of the Cuckoo Flower are where the Orange Tip Butterfly lays her eggs in May and June. Next time you are walking, take a peek underneath the flowers and you may see the yellow eggs at the base of the flowers. They take a few weeks to hatch and then get busy eating the Cuckoo flower leaving the seeds to fall to the ground to germinate next year.

No Mow May is one thing we can all do to help wildlife recover. But now it is over, there is still lots you can do to help.

Reducing your mowing to every 4 weeks allows so many life cycles to complete and increases the diversity of flowers in the grass. Even better is leaving an area for the whole summer to support lots of different wildlife species in a whole host of ways. You will find so many exciting and surprising species taking up residence in your new habitat.

Long grass develops deeper roots, which means it locks up more carbon and protects the soil from erosion. The long roots provide perfect habitat for the extraordinary range of wildlife in the soil and increases the biomass dramatically.

Longer grass also provides much needed cool spaces for wildlife to retreat to from the heat in summer. Did you know that the temperature in long grass can be dramatically lower than in short grass and half the temperature of roads? When the road hits 40°c, the temperature in long grass might only be 20°c.

The simplest of changes can really help and even a small wildlife area can make a huge contribution. If you would like some advice on what you can do to support more wildlife in your garden, please email **lifeclimatechange@gmail.com** and our volunteers will be delighted to help.

During the year we accepted the resignation through ill health of our Chair Paul Mason, also of our past Chair Harry Franklin, and of Simeon Cole who no longer lives in the parish. We thank them all for their dedication in representing the residents. Happily, we have now been joined by three new councilllors: Gabbie Franklin and David Cross for

Michaelchurch and Graeme Deas for Vowchurch. We now have a full compliment of councillors, and they bring valuable skills to help our work on your behalf. We are fortunate in the able assistance of our clerk, Linda Cowles, who ensures the smooth running of our parish council.

We continue to employ a lengsthman to maintain the roadways and lanes, and as reported last year were successful in being granted extra funds to address some longstanding problems. This was completed by last May, but unfortunately some of the culverts have become blocked again. We would stress that in Herefordshire landowners are responsible for maintaining the ditches alongside their land. There is another tranche of money available this year for further works, but less money is available this year.

The issue of a speed limit on the B4348 remains. Each year the Highways Department draw up a list of proposed speed limits and these are prioritized. If there are some urgent requests then our application is likely to drop down the list, but the fact that it has been on the list for so long does mean that we are edging ever closer to it being enacted.

The issue of internet access highlighted in last year's report continues to be a source of concern. Councillor Engel has, together with Councillor Toby Murcott of Bacton, been meeting with our Ward Councillor Peter Jinman, and our MP Jesse Norman. Gigaclear have stepped back from their contract and there are now new approaches being explored to ensure connectivity for all in the future.

During the year Herefordshire asked parishes to review their Neighbourhood Plans, which we did. It was decided that our Neighbourhood Plan remained relevant and that no changes were needed. However, we have engaged in the consultation on future development for 2021–2041. This is looking at where new housing should be built in the light of central government's requirement for a given number of houses to be built within the county. We continue to consider planning applications and make comments.

Parish Councils were asked to consider preparing a resilience plan for their area. I am grateful to Councillor Chadwick for taking a lead on this. When it is completed, it will be on the website, but we will also need to consider other ways of distributing the information in case of an emergency. Although we are unlikely to face the devastating floods that have occurred in parts of Herefordshire, extreme weather events such as Storm Arwen have shown us that we could have loss of power over a wide area, landlines down, damaged buildings or landslides.

You may know that the contract for Public Rights of Way and Traffic Regulation Order management is now 'in house' at Herefordshire County Council. All the parishes have a volunteer footpath officer who will be walking each of the footpaths in their patch at least once a year and reporting any problems, but you too can report any problem online on the Herefordshire website.

We are grateful for the regular attendance of our Ward Councillor Peter Jinman at our meetings, for his ability to keep us informed of what is going on at county level, and also for the attendance of our local police.






