

From the Clergy

From May to July, I'll be taking a break from parish ministry to embark on a sabbatical. Full-time clergy in the Church of England are encouraged to take a sabbatical every 10 years however, due to the pandemic and other colleagues' sabbaticals, it's 15 years since my ordination, so this will be both my first and last sabbatical.

A sabbatical is a time to reflect, rest and be refreshed. My plans involve pilgrimages in the Orkneys and north Wales and a series of walks with a 'walk and talk' therapist, as I consider whether accompanied walking might be helpful for some of our pastoral encounters or when mentoring local leaders.

Lent begins on Wednesday 5th March (so, yes, that means it's Pancake Day on Tuesday 4th!), our annual invitation to find space for reflection, rest and spiritual refreshment as we look forward to Easter. It is possible to find some precious sabbatical space with God within our usual daily rhythm and routine. Some time for quiet prayer in the morning or perhaps just before bed, or a half hour walk at lunchtime noticing God in creation. If you enjoy reading, you might like to read through Luke's gospel from which most of our Sunday readings come this year. Or give one of the many Lent-themed books a try, 'Wild bright hope' is The Big Church Read's Lent book for 2025 and their website includes both an introduction to the book and questions to consider as you read it. Perhaps a podcast works for you whilst you're driving or doing other chores, The Prayer Book Society podcast offers 5 Lent talks by Lord Chartres, entitled 'God, Faith and Doubt'.

Whether you find time to pray, read, listen, walk or just sit down with a cup of tea and think what you feel grateful for today, may you have a blessed and restful Lent. Revd Luci



LONGTOWN COMMUNITY PRIMARY AND PRE-SCHOOL

Another half term has flown by, and we are looking forward to the Spring. The snowdrops are already here, and I am sure there will be daffodils soon ready for St David's Day. The weather hasn't been too cruel, and the children have managed to do lots of exciting activities both indoors and out.

Class 4 have had a fabulous half term of climbing at the LOLT and so after the holiday it will be class 3's turn. They can't wait! Our Year 4's have already had a little taster as we got offered 2 days of free sessions concentrating on confidence building and teamwork. Even in the pouring rain,

the children still came back smiling and full of enthusiasm-if not a little soggy!

Class 4 did us proud at their netball tournament in Kingstone High School. They showed amazing sportsmanship and fair play, cheered each other on and worked brilliantly as a team, coming second overall.

Class 2 and Reception had a very special visit from Animals Interactive in February. They got to learn all about lots of different animals and even got to hold a snake, lizards, rabbits, guinea pigs, mice, a rat, a skunk, an owl and a fox! The children were very calm and caring handling the animals even though they were very excited!

Our Early Years children continue to explore and learn in the outdoors. They have been balancing on a wobbly tightrope, balancing on beams, checking the bird feeders they made, making birds' nests and playing in the mud kitchen.

Class 3 have been learning about Crime and Punishment experiencing what it must have been like for a Victorian prisoner. They tried oakum picking, the shot drill, the crank and tread wheel. Then they wrote all about it in their diary writing. They unanimously agreed that they are all very glad that they are not living in Victorian Times!

Our Patron of Reading, published author Catherine Barr, visited us and told us all about her new book "The Story of the Albatros". It looks amazing! Class 4 also had the opportunity to go and listen to the author MG Leonard in Crickhowell. They had a fantastic morning and couldn't stop talking about it on their return to school.

MICHAELCHURCH ESCLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

We are now well into the Spring Term and things have been very busy up at Michaelchurch Escley Primary and Preschool. It is a shocking thought too, that our Year 6s are now halfway through their final year at primary school!

Already this term there has been so much happening across the school. Sapling Class are currently enjoying a topic centred around the changes to the world brought about by the invention of the railway and in particular, the steam engine. They were very excited therefore, to have Adam, a parent, local farmer and engineer, come into school and bring with him a working model steam engine. Adam demonstrated the running of the engine and expertly explained how it functioned. The children really enjoyed the experience and learned so much from it.

Meanwhile, Acorn Class, whose topic on Castles has had them learning all about fortresses and the people who built and lived in them, were treated to an exiting visit to Caerphilly Castle. Caerphilly Castle is the 2nd largest castle in Great Britain and a wonderful illustration for the children of the art of fortress building in the 11th and 12th centuries. The children from Acorn Class had a super time exploring the many rooms and passageways of this amazing building.

In Oak Class the children have been learning all about the ancient Greeks and they have particularly enjoyed finding out about Alexander the Great. One of their favourite Alexander stories is about how he defeated the Persian ruler Darius II at the battle of Gaugamela. To consolidate the learning they had done in class, Mr Crocker took Oak Class out onto the field and, with the Persian and Macedonian armies the children had prepared, they re-enacted the battle, modelling the careful manoeuvring of his forces which Alexander carried out to defeat Darius so comprehensibly. Suffice to say they had tremendous fun recreating the battle. Not only that, our anecdotal evidence – feedback from past pupils/parents - is that this type of learning is a fantastic way to embed subject knowledge.

Preschool continue to lead very active, outdoor lives. Our preschool children really are the embodiment of the saying, 'there is no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothing', as any visitor to the school would witness our littlest children exploring the Spinney, heading up into the hills or down to Elke's Woods whatever the weather, and with big smiles on

their faces! Unlike most people, they seem to enjoy the wetter weather - something to do with mud slides I think!

Coming up in the next half term we still have much to look forward to. For starters, children from Years 5 and 6 will be heading off to a Herefordshire Schools Football Tournament at the Cathedral School playing fields. This will be the 4th time we have sent a team along and the children are very excited to be representing their school at this wonderful sporting event.

Also coming up is World Book Day. This is a very special time at Michaelchurch with our bookish celebrations spanning 2 whole days. Not only will we be dressing up and engaging in book related activities, the whole school – excluding preschool – will also be spending the day in Hay on Wye visiting different book shops throughout the town.

Hot on the heels of the Hay on Wye trip, Oak Class will be heading down to Cardiff to visit the Techniquest Science and Discovery Centre – a trip the children, and teachers, are really excited about.

Finally, the whole school will be getting in touch with their inner Kevin McCouds when the children take part in a series of architecture workshops, constructing castles, Ferris wheels and even a model Acropolis to link with the children's topics.






