From the Clergy

Dear Friends,

In the Lord's Prayer, we pray: Thy kingdom come....

This month, 'kingdom' is something we'll be thinking and talking about a lot as we celebrate the coronation of King Charles III. Who the monarch is sets the tone for the whole kingdom (and indeed the whole commonwealth). They are one of the most influential voices in our society and their priorities, interests, and character will (for good or ill) shape our own and will be a lens through which history will remember us. What does it mean to be an Elizabethan? A Georgian? A Victorian? An Edwardian? I wonder, what will it mean to be a "Windsorian"?

In Christianity, we believe that there is a ruler *above* our earthly monarchs and presidents. Jesus is called the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, and Jesus often talked about 'the Kingdom of God' or 'the Kingdom of Heaven'. For followers of Jesus, we believe that our identity is more shaped by our citizenship of this heavenly rule than that of any nation or political party. We believe that God's priority, interests, and character should guide how we lead our lives. God cares about the poor, the lost, the lonely, the hurt, and the outcast – and so must we.

Jesus describes this purpose in Luke 4:18-19:

"[God] has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

This is also our mission: to reveal God's restoring love to the world. When we pray 'thy kingdom come', we are praying that not only will we look to God's rule in our lives, but also that the whole world will know his mercy and forgiveness. We are praying for an end to suffering, an end to hunger, an end to oppression - and that we may discover *our* part in making that happen.

My sincerest hope is that we will all come to see the world through God's lens of compassion, mercy, and forgiveness.

Dr Marion Loeffler: Lord and Lady Llanofer of Llanofer, Abergavenny

Lady Llanofer is renowned for her promotion of Welsh culture, language, and music, especially harp playing, and creating the "traditional" Welsh women's costume, including the hat. She was the driving force behind the Abergavenny Eisteddfodau which ran from 1834-1853. An early supporter of the temperance movement, she banned the sale of alcohol on her estate. Lord Llanofer, Benjamin Hall, nicknamed "Big Ben" supervised the rebuilding of Parliament which included the tower and famous clock.

Concerts for Craswall

World-class Musicians to Perform in Dore Abbey Saturday June 24th 2023 at 7pm

MAJOR artists from the world of classical music are heading to Herefordshire this summer for a performance in the historic Dore Abbey.

Now in its 29th consecutive year, local charity **Concerts for Craswall** consistently attracts leading national and international musicians to the area, performing some dazzling repertoire. This year's summer concert is no exception featuring a trio of international musicians with music by many epoch defining composers such as Mozart, Clarke, Debussy, Adès, Clara Schumann and Bruch.

One of the most sought-after violists of his generation, **Timothy Ridout** is a former BBC New Generation Artist, Borletti-Buitoni Trust fellow, and winner of the Royal Philharmonic Society 2023 Young Artist Award. In 2020, he won Hamburger

Symphoniker's inaugural Sir Jeffrey Tate Prize and joined the Bowers Program of the Chamber Music Society of the Lincoln Center in 2021.

This season he appears as soloist with the BBC Symphony Orchestra, Tokyo Metropolitan, hr-Sinfonieorchester, Odense, San Jose symphony orchestras and Netherlands Chamber Orchestra amongst others. Other highlights include recitals and chamber concerts at Wigmore Hall, Concertgebouw Amsterdam and Philharmonie Köln. Further afield, Ridout embarks on a South American tour with the Chamber Society of the Lincoln Centre, returns to Taipei for a series of concerts, and tours Australia with Musica Viva.

One of Europe's leading clarinettists, **Matthew Hunt** is a distinctive musician, renowned for the vocal quality of his playing and his ability to communicate with audiences. He holds the position of solo clarinettist with the Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie Bremen and is a member of the Sheffield based chamber group Ensemble 360.

A very keen chamber musician, he appears regularly with Meta4, the Chiurascuro and Elias quartets, Thomas Adès, Pekka Kuusisto, Emily Beynon, Nicholas Altstaedt, Alina Ibragimova, and La Bande de La Loingtaine amongst others.

Born in Scotland, pianist **Alasdair Beatson** tours prolifically as soloist and chamber musician, broadcasting and performing regularly around the world and regularly at London's Wigmore Hall. Adept on modern and historical instruments, he is renowned as both performer and pedagogue.

Notable performances in 2022/23 include regular appearances at Wigmore Hall, in concert with Steven Isserlis, Viktoria Mullova, the Doric and Maxwell string quartets, as member of the Nash Ensemble, and in festivals including Cheltenham, Ernen, Festivalta, Lewes, O/Modernt, Resonances, Spitalfields and Yellowbarn.




