From the Clergy

I will hear what God the LORD will speak: for he will speak peace unto his people. Psalm 85:8

As this edition of the Black Mountains Group newsletter went to press, the Queen was in Cardiff, meeting, among others, a selection of the Community Champions nominated by Members of the Senedd for significant contributions to those around them during the pandemic: the Sixth Former who set up a COVID statistics site, the young woman who made a stream of comic videos, those who ran marathons and baked hundreds of cheesecakes for charity, the catering businesses who turned their assets to feeding vulnerable families. The last year has seen ordinary people step up in extraordinary ways to meet the needs of those who have been less able to adapt, providing meals, shopping and company. The NHS volunteering service stopped taking applications within days of the launch because it was over-subscribed. Volunteers for non-professional roles in COVID vaccine clinics have to move fast when shifts are offered because slots are snapped up within hours.

But shift the scene to other front lines. Service providers from retail shops to doctors' surgeries report a rise in hostile behaviour to staff. Some people are responding to inevitable strains in the health system with anger directed at individuals. Charities working with the victims of race hate crime report rises in racist abuse. Empathy seems to be one of the things we are running short of, along with petrol. We are all a bit anxious, and boundaries around what constitutes a "return to normality" are fluid.

We know that both these versions of our community are authentic. It's a cliché that crisis brings out the best and the worst in us. But observing the paradox may not be enough. The first version is robust but we can't take it for granted. We can choose on which side of the scales to press our finger. Or, to change the metaphor, by celebrating the candles that others are lighting, and lighting a few of our own, we identify as people of light. Matches, anyone?

Nigel told us about the extensive network of "Blood Bikes" across the UK and how the work of the Severn Freewheelers fits into this impressive coast to coast transportation service, assisting the NHS by moving blood, human milk, pharmaceuticals and paperwork to improve patient care. It was a fascinating look at a littleknown charity that took 7,079 calls, and travelled 219,000 miles in 2020 due to the massive uplift in demand caused by the coronavirus pandemic. 
