

# From the Clergy

Have you ever met an unhappy generous person?

Being generous with your time and money is a core tenet of Christianity, as it is for Judaism and Islam. But some recent research has shown that being generous activates your brain's pleasure centre, reducing the level of stress hormones in your body. As a result, people who give time or money to support causes they care about experience greater happiness and psychological well-being. They are even likely to live longer!

A recent report from Stewardship, a charity that helps Christians be the best stewards of the resources they have been given, found that there are four overarching characteristics that are the foundation for a generous mindset.

The first one is gratitude. If we recognise that what we have in life is a gift or a blessing we are more likely to give back for what we have been so fortunate to receive.

The second one is empathy. If you have had first-hand experience of being in need you are more alert to other people's needs and inclined to respond by giving your time, skills and or money to help alleviate that need.

The third characteristic is a sense of responsibility which we feel when we see and understand the needs around us. For example, we recognise the long-term costs for our favourite charities to keep going so we will plan and commit our resources to ensure that the good work can continue.

And finally, there is trust. Are we willing to give our money away without controlling how and where it gets spent? Generous people want to give thoughtfully and wisely with a sense of trust in what they are giving to. Which means that organisations we give to must show that they are well run, that they achieve their outcomes and they are led with integrity.

Some people find it hard to talk about money, it's a bit rude – yet the Bible talks about wealth and possessions in 2,450 instances – more than any other topic except love. Of the 38 or so parables in the New Testament 16 are concerned with possessions. Jesus was not afraid to mention the subject.

Living a generous life – whether or not we are Christians – means that we need to slow down and notice how we can love and care for others. It is in the noticing that we can become generous. Spending time in prayer and contemplation helps us to become more spiritually generous and to pay attention to the needs of our neighbours both locally and further afield. Interestingly – with some notable exceptions - the richer people are, the less generous they tend to be.

Happiness is a fluffy concept but it's something most of us want. Back to my original question – have you met an unhappy generous person?

To mark the 180th Anniversary since its Foundation in 1844 there was a special service led by Rev Luci. We were given a summary of how the church came to be built and the reminiscences of 4 previous parishioners. The tea afterwards in the Parish room was plenteous with more reminiscences shared over Mary's delicious sandwiches and cakes from many kind bakers.

# LONGTOWN COMMUNITY PRIMARY AND PRE-SCHOOL

Autumn is here and with the leaves falling and the days getting shorter we must be heading for half term. It's a beautiful time of year in Longtown with our gorgeous trees turning golden and the ground snuggled in a warm blanket of leaves. But as the days get shorter, Longtown Community Primary School becomes a glimmer of light in the darkening days, packed full of exciting projects, challenges, hard work and adventures. Here is a peek through the windows of what has been happening in school this month.

All our classes have focused on outdoor activities this term. Our youngest children and pre-school love being outdoors and have been doing all sorts of wonderful activities from

going on a bug hunt, picking blackberries to make a crumble, climbing the trees in our woods, gathering unusually shaped sticks and making Scarecrows for our Harvest celebration. All classes have had an element of outside cooking (and eating!) this term.

Class 2 were inspired by Goldilocks, using fire to make porridge for the three bears. They have been using natural objects to help with their storytelling and made a shelter for Little Red Riding hood's grandmother.

Class 3 had a great time river dipping down by Clodock Church and improving their tree identification skills with knowledge about leaves and shapes of canopies.

Class 4 have extended their skills by learning how to safely light a fire and do some outdoor cooking. This time they made a delicious vegetable soup, just right for the Autumn. They also learnt how to preserve blackberries by pickling them in vinegar. An acquired taste!

We were once again very pleased to welcome Ms Vicky Harold from Fairfield High School's Science department, to support Class 4's learning about the circulation system, specifically the heart. Wonderful Mailes butchers in Ewyas Harold provided us with a pig's heart to examine and Ms Harold gave the children some hands-on experience of dissection, though some preferred to watch from a distance. Thank you, Ms Harold, for your valuable time and expertise.

At the very end of September, we had a truly exciting visit from Team GB member Natalie Powell, who shared her experiences as an Olympic athlete and inspired us to complete a sponsored circuit training afternoon to raise money for PE equipment in school. The highlight of the afternoon was when Natalie 'threw' the teachers as she would in Judo. The cheers could be heard in Abergavenny!

On September 27th we held a Macmillan Coffee morning in school. Having sent out the invitations and had huge amounts of cake donated, we waited with bated breath to see how many guests would arrive. With much relief we had a lovely lot of guests who came in and had a cup of tea and piece of cake with us. It was lovely to sit and chat with friends from our community who don't come into school very often and share stories about Longtown and the school. On top of that, we raised an amazing £300.00 for Macmillan, a hugely successful day all round.

The 8th October saw us hold our Harvest Celebration at Longtown Salem Baptist Chapel. Always generous and welcoming we had a wonderful afternoon at the Chapel. The children had prepared poetry, dance and, of course, the classic Harvest songs to share with our parents and friends. We would like to thank everyone who made a donation of food, we sent a wonderful amount to Hereford Food Bank.

To top off our Harvest Celebrations the wonderful Wild by Nature team at Lower House Farm and The Bull's Head, Craswall, hosted a Harvest Feast on Saturday 12th October, to raise funds for school. The lucky guests were treated to the most delicious feast and entertained by a small group of pupils singing some of their harvest favourites. Even the Harvest scarecrows made an appearance. We wish to say a huge thank you to the Wild by Nature Team and everyone who supported this exciting event.

Our Stay and Play sessions grow from strength to strength. These run on the first and third Friday of the month in term time. Remaining dates are 15th November, 6th and 20th December 2024. The children have a great time in and out of pre-school, playing on and around our pirate ship, meeting Eric the rabbit, and having a delicious snack prepared by Ruth Sevenoaks, the organiser. Adults enjoy a cup of tea or coffee along with a chance to socialise with other parents. We love seeing new faces in school.

Clubs this half term have included Multi-Activity Club, Netball Club, Art Club and Dance Club with 2Faced Dance Company a long with an Outdoor Activity club run by Mike Fawcett at Longtown Outdoor Learning Trust Centre, just down the road.

Finally, our older pupils enjoyed a virtual session with prize winning author Hannah Gold, who told them all about her new book 'Turtle Moon.' What a great insight into the life of an author, setting aspirations running high amongst our budding authors in school.

We are opening our doors once again on Tuesday 22nd October between 9.30am and 11.30am for our annual OPEN DAY. Everyone is welcome to come and have a look at a normal working morning in school. Even if you just want to the opportunity to have a look round this fantastic little school, we would be happy to see you. No need to book, though if you would like a session later in the day between 3pm and 5pm please contact the school office.

Parents and carers will be coming into school after half term for their chance to speak to the teachers and look at their children's books and displays. We enjoy working closely with our parents to ensure that our pupils are well supported and challenged in school.

Class 1 and 2 will be whisked away for a Christmas treat in December on the Brecon Mountain Railway for their Santa Special trip. I'm sure they will all be on his good list!

Our Christmas performance this year will be a Walking Nativity starting at Longtown Castle and walking to our school grounds, following the journey of Mary and Joseph on that night in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago. Parents will be treated to a wonderful performance by our younger pupils, followed by refreshments to keep us warm. I can't wait!

Exciting news, our first Drop Off as a local Re-use and Recycle Hub will be on Wednesday 20th November. We will be a collection point for our local community to drop-off items to be recycled and reused. Please see our Facebook page for more details.

### MICHAELCHURCH ESCLEY PRIMARY SCHOOL

There have been many lovely things happening already this term and one of these was Oak Class, our Year 5 and 6s, exciting trip to Cardiff to visit the Cardiff Reform Synagogue to learn about Judaism and Jewish worship. They also popped in for a natural history workshop at the National Museum, Cardiff. It was a really fun and informative trip and a great enhancement to the learning the children are doing in class.

Meanwhile, Acorn Class, our youngest children, headed off into the Forest of Dean to visit Puzzlewood. Acorn Class's topic this half term is *The Enchanted Wood* so Miss Cook, their teacher, arranged this fantastic trip to help fire up the children's imaginations and provide inspiration for their writing. The children had a super time and came back full of ideas.

Not to be outdone, Sapling Class, who have been learning about the Stone Age, had a Stone Age Workshop, with a special visitor who brought a whole load of stone age paraphernalia with them and taught the children about prehistoric humans through a mix of drama and getting hands on with artefacts. The children had a great time and definitely learnt a lot - the mammoth hunt at the start of the day was definitely a big hit!

We also had a visit from Olympic and Commonwealth judoka, Natalie Powell, who talked to the children about her amazing life and career. She also gave the children a full workout with a special fitness session and gave some of the children, and staff, the chance to be on the other end of a judo throw!

Pre-school are continuing to get outside, exploring our lovely local environment, as much as possible. Despite the somewhat damp weather, our intrepid team and our resilient pre-school children have been tromping up hills and over streams, kitted out in their waterproofs and wellies, enjoying the great outdoors. Autumn is always a very busy time in pre-school so keep an eye out for news of all the exciting things they will be getting up to over the next few weeks. Also keep an eye out for news of our Welly Walks which will be resuming again soon. These lovely walks in our beautiful setting, are open to children and families up to the age of 4 and are led by our highly experienced pre-school manager, Julie Christopher.

Coming up we have a really exciting drumming workshop to look forward to with the incredible Landing (drumming

superstar!). Oak also have a visitor from the Sealed Knot historical society to kick off their topic on the English Civil War. However, the second half of the autumn term is all about Christmas in primary school so keep an eye out for details of our Christmas Fayre and our Walking Nativity!

In other news, at the end of September, we had the most lovely get together in the Escleyside Hall, to mark 10 years since Michaelchurch Escley Primary and Pre-School was prevented from closure by a determined group of governors, parents and members of the local community. When I first came to the school at the start of the summer term in 2014, there were just 19 pupils on roll. However, with the backing of an amazing school and local community the school thrived and now has 60 children attending, along with a fantastic and highly popular pre-school. Consequently, it felt only right to mark this amazing milestone and thank everyone who had made the school's success possible and what better way to mark it than with a party, a ceilidh in fact! It was wonderful to see so many familiar faces there and in particular, so many past pupils. I was very excited to learn about all the wonderful things they had been up to since leaving primary school and what life had in stall for them now. Many of the young people I met, were either at or heading off to universities around the country, some were students at art college, others travelling the world, working their way around the globe and one young man was heading off to New Zealand, a contract to play rugby for a team under his belt! Here's to the next 10 years!

If you have symptoms that suggest you may have one of these conditions, you can walk into a pharmacy and be offered a consultation with a pharmacist in a private consultation room.






