



#### From the Clergy

#### ARE YOU TOO BUSY?

More than thirty years ago when my children were small we read a wonderful book together by Jill Murphy called 'Five minutes peace'. It's the story of how Mrs Large finds some quiet amongst the hurly burly of small children; her eventual solution was a bath. She could lock the door and keep everyone out. This tale resonates just as much with my two daughters today, as they cope with their lively toddlers. But it's not just mums with small children who need some rest and quiet occasionally – we all do.

We live in a culture where being busy seems to be a badge of honour. Being busy makes us feel that we are achieving things, perhaps because when we are busy we feel important, essential and needed. I met a friend the other day and we exchanged news. He is retired and I asked what he was doing in his retirement. More often than not the answer to this question is volunteering for a charity or two or even three, being a churchwarden, gardening, looking after grandchildren and so on. In this case, though, he said – reading, purely for pleasure, mid 20th century novels in particular. I was really struck by this answer – he was giving himself time to read and think and imagine and remember.

In the bible we are never told how busy Jesus is – he has time to notice the potential disciple standing watching him, and for the woman who wanted to touch the hem of his garment even though the disciples were trying to hurry him by. He made time for his friends like Lazarus, Martha and Mary. Jesus had a clear idea of his priorities. He didn't need to be busy for the sake of it. His relationship with God was unpretentious – he knew that God knew everything about him and that God loved him unconditionally. He didn't try to be something he wasn't. His priority was the work God called him to do. Nor was Jesus afraid to say to God as he did in the Garden of Gethsemane, "I'm frightened, I don't want to do this". And God gave him the strength to do it.

Too often we use busyness as an excuse not to have to think about or do things that are really important – such as our relationship with God. We let our self-image get in the way and lose focus on what really matters. And we can then end up trying to please everyone and losing out ourselves.

We are now in October and the run up to Christmas starts all too soon. Before then, how about making time to think about whether you are trying to do good or whether you are trying to make yourself look good. What do you really need to do, and what should be on your 'not to do list'?

How about making time for a bath and five minutes peace to consider it?

#### DORE COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT - THE DRIVING FORCE

Many of you will be familiar with the red DCT vehicles seen driving around SW Herefordshire and hopefully you will know what we do.

What might come as a surprise is that we have now been operating for 23 years having started way back in 2000. This is quite an achievement for a small charity, manned entirely by volunteer drivers.

It all started with a few volunteers' cars; later we added one small vehicle of our own and we have grown steadily until today we have a fleet of 6 vehicles, 4 of which are converted to carry wheelchairs. When requirements dictate our volunteers also use their own cars.

This takes a lot of organising and our office staff, Sarah and Sue, have become very skilled at ensuring we meet the needs of our community, while Claire deals with all the admin to keep us on the road.

While we have the vehicles and staff we need to manage the charity, as always, we need more volunteer drivers and would welcome enthusiastic people who would be happy to give up some time to drive for us and help this community. The driving can vary from short local trips to a full day when one could cover say 120 miles. How much one does is up to the individual.

If you are interested you will be joining a committed group of volunteers who provide an essential service to people of all ages who do not have access to transport. It is a rewarding way of spending a few hours a week and is much appreciated by our passengers.

If driving is not for you, but you require transport and you think that we can help, ring the number above and talk to Sue or Sarah. We only carry people who do not have their own transport and cannot readily use public transport, but there are no limits on age or on reasons why you want to travel. We also keep our fares as low as we can.

#### SUMMER MEADOWS IN LONGTOWN

When passing the Castle Green this summer you will have noticed a patch of grass that was uncut. You may even have wandered over to read the signs which kept a tally of all the flowers spotted in this small patch. Many tourists certainly gathered around to find out what treasures our community has.

We wanted to let it grow to see what was living there and we were very pleasantly surprised.

Spring began with the expected explosion of yellow, white and pink flowers we see on most verges in the area but, as the season progressed, more and more surprises emerged.

Standing next to the patch you could not help but hear the grasshoppers chatting away or see lots of butterflies and other pollinators busying themselves in the long grasses. As we picked our way through the grasses to survey, clouds of moths would erupt. There is no doubt that it became an important habitat over the summer months.

We spotted 32 different species of wildflowers (we didn't count the grass species this year) in that little spot. Some of the unexpected highlights were the Common Spotted Orchids that suddenly appeared, Ragged Robin, Meadow Cranesbill and the Harebells who popped their heads up right at the end of summer. We added our findings to 2023's Great Meadow Search which is a UK-wide project to map the health of our meadows.

The banks of the Castle Green are home to even more species. Next year, we hope to get the bracken under control to allow these flowers to become more established (watch out for a community bracken-pulling session in spring).

The Castle Green is an ancient grassland, full of species that would have once dominated our local grasslands. We hope that continuing to manage parts of the area for wildlife will help to sustain our biodiversity for future generations while still keeping essential space for play and recreation.



At **3pm on Saturday 4th November** Chris Green will read from his gripping new novel *The House beneath the Black Hill* at The Cornewall Arms in Clodock.



For composer Nick Mortimer it is a dream come true when he and his sister Kate inherit a house in the village of Clodock in a remote corner of Herefordshire's Black Mountains. But it is a dream that soon turns into a nightmare when they are confronted by a series of mysterious and frightening events. Their search to find answers unearths a tragic tale of blighted love set against the background of the disturbing political and social divisions of the late 1920s.

The author will also be signing copies of his novel at Hopes of Longtown between 10am-12 noon on Saturday 2nd December.

It is a story of the loss and rediscovery of love and faith, set against the background of the wilds of Bardsey Island off the North Wales coast. In his second novel, *The House Beneath the Black Hill*, he combines his fascination in the telling of a good ghost story with his interest in the turbulent politics of the late 1920s, highlighted by the remarkable electoral victory of journalist and author Frank Owen over his Tory rival in Hereford in the 1929 General Election.

As a former Popular Events Director City of the London Festival, Director of The Poetry Society and Chief Executive of the British Academy of Songwriters, Composers & Authors (now The Ivors Academy), Chris knows all about the challenges faced by the creative community. He's well versed in politics too having contested Hereford and South Herefordshire for the Liberal Democrats in the 1979, 1983 and 1987 Parliamentary elections where he came within a whisker of taking the seat.

He is married with two grown-up sons and lives with his wife, Sheila, in the village of Garway.
