





CAT'S BACK FELL RACE

Sunday **20th October 2024** will welcome a new event in the South Wales Winter Hill Race series.

The Cat's Back fell race (aka Ras Crib y Garth) starts in the Monnow Valley from Mountain Mayhem's base at Tybubach, Craswall and will take in the Cat's Back ridge and Association rules. The distance is 5 miles and height gain is 1380 ft. The race course climbs steeply on footpaths through farmland before reaching the base of the ridge at the Cat's Back car park. From this point on runners are on the open fell following the classic ridgeline of old red sandstone all the way to the summit of Black Hill where it's a quick 'once around the trig', an electronic dib at the compulsory checkpoint and a fast return descent to the start field.

The course will be partially marked and marshalled by volunteers from Longtown Mountain Rescue Team. A donation will be made to Longtown MRT from race proceeds.

The race team are very grateful to Vicki and Fred at Mountain Mayhem for hosting the event. This is private property. Any 'recce' runs must stick to the public footpaths. More information about the race can be found at fellrace.com Entries on line only:

The horse-drawn cider mill at Fair Oak, Bacton, HR2 0AT, will be open to visitors on Saturday and Sunday, October 26 and 27, from 11 am until 4 pm. It is just ten years since we started working the mill again with a horse.

We are thrilled that our young Gypsy Cob, Featherstone, will be making his debut. He has been nurtured and trained at Fair Oak by Vika Engel, and tutored by Wendy and John Lloyd, who own our original mill horses. Now four years old, Feathers seems to be taking the new job calmly in his stride.

He will probably finish milling by lunchtime, but will be happy to receive visitors during the afternoon while the cidermakers are working the old press.

Cider made last autumn will be available to taste and buy – including two single varieties, the popular Sparkling, and the latest batch of Fair Oak cider brandy.

Also on show will be the documentary film made by David Bishop, *Horse-powered in Herefordshire*.

LONGTOWN COMMUNITY PRIMARY AND PRE-SCHOOL

What a fantastic start we've had to our new school year. The children have settled really quickly and for some that has meant settling into new classes with new teachers too. When I walk around the school, I am so proud to see such enthusiastic learning, listening, teamwork and keenness to dig deeper!

Class 3 have already begun their swim lessons at Halo and all classes are enjoying Outdoor learning lessons in the sun! This links in with their World War 2 history topic, focusing on the Land Girls and digging for victory. We are pleased to be holding a MacMillan Coffee Morning this year, on Friday 27th September from 9:30am to 11am. Everyone is welcome, the more the merrier. Please help us to support this very important cause.

On Friday 27th Sept we will be visited by double Olympian and Commonwealth games champion Natalie Powell, GB Judo, who will be leading us in a sponsored circuit training session and look at the importance of regular exercise to keep us healthy and strong.

Our annual Harvest Celebration will again be held at Longtown Baptist Chapel on **Tuesday 8th Oct.** The school is already ringing with the sound of Harvest songs being practised and we will be taking food donations to the local food bank. We are so lucky this year that our friends at Wild by Nature are hosting a Harvest Feast this year on **Saturday 12th October at 12:30pm** in Lower House Farm, Longtown. On **Oct 11th** KS2 will again be joining a virtual book launch with acclaimed author Hannah Gold, winner of the Waterstones Children's Book Prize and the Blue Peter Book Awards in 2022.

After a hugely successful Ofsted inspection in Spring 2024 we will be holding our Open Day on **Wed 16th October** from 9:15am to 11:30am for you to see the inner workings of our day in school from Pre-school to Year 6, indoors and out. If you are just starting on your school journey and would like to visit our pre-school setting or looking at settling older

children further up the school after a move, you are all very welcome.

Later in the year the children will enjoy specialised sessions with the Longtown Outdoor Trust with activities such as fire lighting, cooking and climbing for the older children and low ropes and team building with the younger ones.

We are also gearing up to become a local Re-use Hub, whereby we will be a collection point on certain dates throughout the year for our local community to drop-off items to be recycled and reused. Watch this space for dates and updates...

Early Years and Pre-school: Our Pre-School and Reception children had an exciting end to their very first day back holding a grand opening celebration for Eric the rabbit who has a very smart new palace! The children joined Eric in nibbling on carrots (and humus) and sipping carrot and passion fruit juice to toast Eric in his new home. An amazing pirate ship has sailed into our Early Years play area and moored up giving the children a whole new area to explore and enjoy. We have also enhanced our indoor play with lots of soft play equipment for our youngest members to enjoy safely.

Pre-School/Early Years Hub is now open for 4 days a week, Monday to Thursday 8:45am to 3:15pm from September, for 2-year-olds and up. We do accept funded places for 15hr and 30 hrs. Our newly reinstated Stay & Play has been a huge success and will be continuing on the first and third Friday of every month, during term time. Dates are 4th and 18th Oct, 1st and 15th November, 6th and 20th December 2024. We would love to see you there.

Clubs: This term we are running two activity clubs OAC – Outdoor Activity Club which is an extended session run at the Longtown Outdoor Learning Trust, where children can enjoy activities such as stand up paddle boarding, stream scrambling and much, much more. Alternatively, we are also running a MAC Multi Activity Club on school grounds during usual school club times which combines team challenges, wide games and sporting activities. The ever-popular Art Club continues, now run as separate KS1 and KS2 groups. We expect explosions of festive craft and creativity throughout the term. KS2 are honing their ball skills at Netball Club with Mrs Reynolds this half term, making the most of the light before it gets too dark to play. 2Faced Dance Company will be running our Dance Club until Christmas. Always full of fun and energy it's a pleasure to welcome them back to school.

Following the Parish Council's request for a speed review along the B4348 from Poston Mill to the junction at C1222 and the C1206 through Vowchurch & Turnastone and after a thorough review in accordance with the Department of Transport (DfT) Circular 01/13 on setting local speed limits, Herefordshire Council have made the decision not to reduce the speed limit along either of these roads. Several engineering measures can be implemented to address concerns regarding specific features along the C1206

through the villages and the Parish Council look forward to hearing from the Traffic Management Officers with their suggestions for the Parish Councils approval. The full report will be available on the Parish Council website in the next few days.

Do you know who owns the notice boards by the telephone exchange in Michaelchurch Escley? If so, can you contact the Parish Clerk please, the Parish Council are considering making some improvements to the boards.
