

# From the Clergy

#### HEAD-BANGING SPERM AND ALL THAT JAZZ

One of the many joys of being a parish priest in this beautiful part of the world is the relatively random sequence of radio programmes that come my way as I travel between encounters. I've chosen the word encounters as, while I'm unceasingly intrigued by people, I detest meetings. Maybe it's my inner Victor Meldrew appearing?

Back to the radio. Snippets from Radio 4's *The Life Scientific* are a favourite, and I almost invariably find a way to hear the whole programme. Jim Al-Khalil, talks with leading scientists about what inspires them and what their discoveries are leading to.

A recent contributor spoke of his work detecting radioactive isotopes – he described them as climate clocks – that reveal how carbon change leads to changes in the climate. His discoveries play a significant part in understanding our impact on the carbon cycle and climate, the health of our oceans, and finding new ways to remove greenhouse gases from the atmosphere.

The next programme in the radio series is about headbanging sperm, and why sperm counts have dropped worldwide by 62% in the last fifty years. Mind boggling, but perhaps not unrelated to carbon change. What goes around, comes around as it were. Our actions and inactions generate energy. Filling the air we breathe and the water we drink with microplastics has a consequence, if not on us directly then on our children and grandchildren.

There's little doubt that nature – of which we are part rather than separate observers – responds to threats in a myriad of ways. There's a part of me that while I glory in the diversity and beauty of humankind, can't but see us as the greatest threat to the planet.

The Church calls this time of year Creationtide – funny word, good aspiration. It asks us to sit with our discoveries, and with what inspires us to change. Perhaps the saddest thing about humans is that we refuse to learn from the past, preferring to imagine that what we each do individually makes no difference. Nothing could be further from the truth. *Mark*



Keep track and you can **pay your council tax, BT, Water, nPower and E.On** at the Post Office on a day you choose.

Non barcoded stamps need to have been used by 31st July 2023 to avoid a surcharge for recipients. Pick up a photocopy form from us for the Swap Out scheme (sorry, run out of packs) to send off any stamps you have found.
