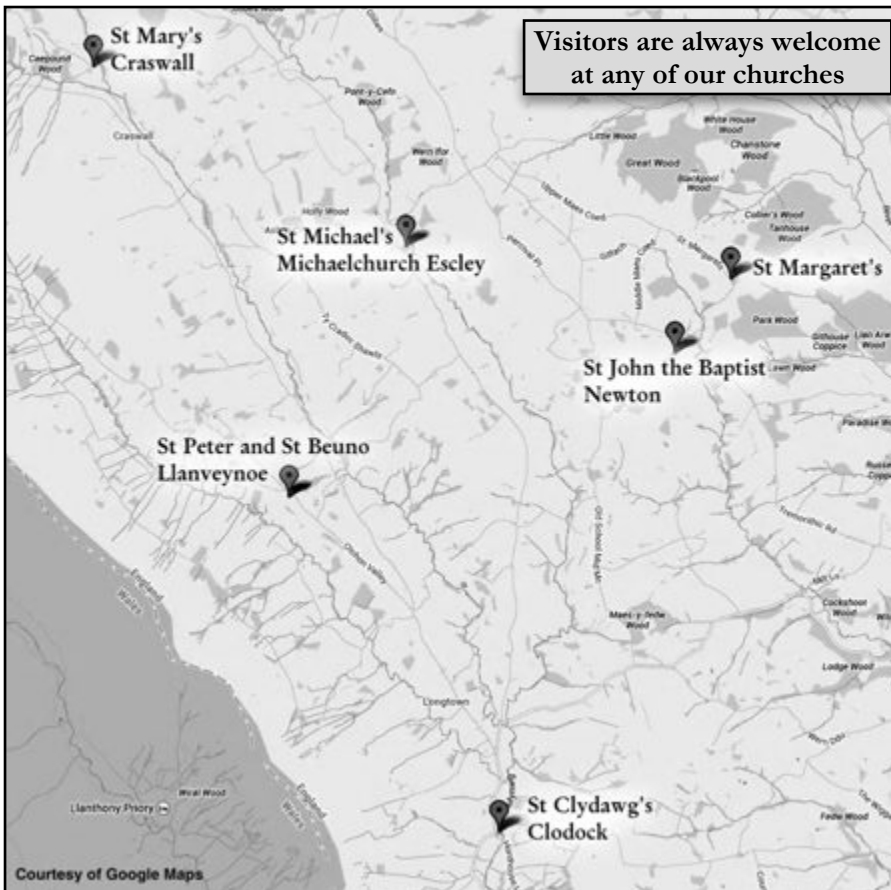

From the Clergy

It's been a summer of contrasts: The Olympics, followed by the Paralympics, brought together the very best sportsmen and women from across the world in Paris. Watching athletes on the start line, each in their own 'zone', entirely focussed on giving their best and then, maybe only seconds later, hugging each other or shaking hands, passing on congratulations or commiserations, each one modelling the Olympic values of excellence, respect and friendship.

At the same time, on the streets of this country, we witnessed riots, criminal damage, physical violence and looting. Ugly scenes triggered by false news generated by those who wish to breed division and hate.

Whilst we might hope that the scenes on our streets were acts of momentary madness, they did reveal people within our society who feel overlooked and unheard. When you feel like this, it's easy to fall prey to those who want you to blame other people for your predicament; people who aren't like you or who don't come from round here.

We may not agree with the way these groups voice their unhappiness but I feel we need to listen if we're to prevent these same scenes happening again. We don't live near the areas where the riots took place but who within our own communities feel similarly overlooked and unheard? Perhaps this is a call for each of us to instigate conversations with people with whom we have little or nothing in common and perhaps, through God's grace, we might learn more about each other.

Pope Francis wrote this prayer in 2018 and it was shared widely on social media in recent weeks - proving that social media can be both a blessing and a curse:

*Lord, make us instruments of your peace.
Help us to recognize the evil latent in a communication that does not build communion.
Help us to remove the venom from our judgments.
Help us to speak about others as our brothers and sisters.
You are faithful and trustworthy;
may our words be seeds of goodness for the world:
where there is shouting, let us practice listening;
where there is confusion, let us inspire harmony;
where there is ambiguity, let us bring clarity;
where there is exclusion, let us offer solidarity;
where there is sensationalism, let us use sobriety
where there is superficiality, let us raise real questions;
where there is prejudice, let us awaken trust;
where there is hostility, let us bring respect;
where there is falsehood, let us bring truth. Amen.*

Dr Toby Jones: The Newport Ship

The Newport ship was discovered in 2002 during preparations for building work. Excavations and lengthy research revealed that it is a unique example of a merchant vessel built in the mid fifteenth century for trading along the Atlantic coast of Europe. But where was it built and why was it armed and how did it end up in Newport? Dr Jones, who started his academic career at Oregon State university, is the Curator of the Newport Ship Project and has written many articles on the vessel.

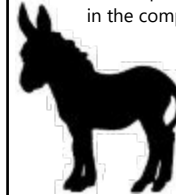

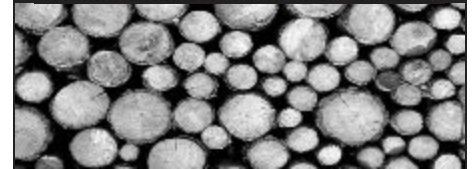
